

PUBLIC POLICY

On Equal Pay Day, AAUW's VP of Government Relations & Advocacy Lisa Maatz joined members of Congress to rally support for the reintroduction of the Paycheck Fairness Act. Equal Pay Day hasn't ended after April 4. The pay gap is worse for women of color. For African women the day will be July 31. For Native American women the day will be Sept. 25. For Latin and Hispanic women Nov. 2.

A new survey indicates that a majority of small business owners support paid family leave programs. Seven out of ten support the Family and Medical Insurance Leave Act, which would create a national paid family and medical leave insurance program.
