During the November branch meeting, we heard an interesting presentation by Trish Garner, our State Public Policy Chair. We were informed about Referendum 101 coming up on the January ballot concerning a temporary assessment affecting hospitals and insurance companies. The referendum is endorsed by AAUW Oregon.

Trish gave us individual handouts for employers and employees which covers a synopsis of an equal pay law which became effective May, 2017. (If you'd like copies, contact Dee). Trish brought along the original 1896 bill covering wages for the same office job (which happened to be \$6 for women and \$12 for men). It was presented to our Oregon AAUW this year due to the group's successful pressuring of the legislature at that time.
