Our branch's own MaryAnne Pitcher informed and entertained us at our January meeting with an excellent program tracing the history of the Butte Creek Mill from its 19th-century opening to its present-day rebuilding and restoration following the Christmas 2014 fire that threatened to eradicate this well-loved local National Historic site.

MaryAnne is managing the rebuilding project, with invaluable help from many people, including Sue Kupillas (who kindly joined us for the program) and others, including actors Jim Belushi and Patrick Duffy. The Butte Creek Mill Foundation, a $501\ c$ (3) organization, is hoping to reach its budget goal of \$2.5 million by its planned re-opening this spring. Rogue Community Savings (and some others) will match all donations to the Foundation made beginning January 7, 2019. FEBRUARY MUSINGS PUBLIC POLICY

Be certain to mark your new 2019 Calendars with April 11-14 as the Oregon AAUW State Convention in Salem! Lobby Day will be a part of the convention, use this chance to visit Oregon legislators face to face.

As of January first, Oregon's Paycheck Fairness Act became law. One direct benefit that this author knows is that her daughter's salary was increased dramatically due to more experience and expertise than her male supervisor's paycheck.

Fairness and Title IX are also on the national agenda of Congress. Let your voice be heard via the Two-Minute Activist of AAUW.

The Oregon Legislature is back in session. Watch for information about HB 2562 to increase funding to OR Department of Education to increase Title IX Coordinators from one 1/4 FTE to 2 FTE's. AAUW is also supporting legislation dealing with increasing problem of age discrimination. If an employer can find one other reason for a negative employment decision, then it's okay — even if age was a factor in the decision.

Finally, it seems like a no-brainer to support bills that seek to give dignity to incarcerated women — including free tampons and sanitary napkins.
