AAUW Educational Projects

Two educational entertainment projects for children, an important part of the program of Medford branch, American Association of University Women, are being continued this fall.

The second winter series of the children's story hour to be broadcast daily over Radio Station KYJC begins Monday, October 3, and the annual children's play will be given this year on Tuesday, October 18, at the Craterian theater. Two consecutive matinee performances of the play will be given this year to accommodate the expected audience.

The KYJC series will be broadcast Monday through Friday at 4 p.m. with the theme song selected last year, "Let the Ball Roll." The story hour is conducted by volunteers from the membership of AAUW for the benefit of small children.

Mrs. Fred Wilcox is chairman of the radio and television committee. Her committee is made up of Miss Jeraldyn Jerome and Miss Anna May, and Mesdames Theodore Garhart, Thomas Eslinger, Ray Frisbie, Frank Roeland and W. A. Scoville.

The annual play, to be given at the Craterian theater, will dramatize the Grimm fairy tale, "The Bremen Town Musicians." Children's Theater of the West will produce the play. Mrs. Harold Cook, fellowship chairman, is in charge of the arrangements.

Mrs. Cook's committee is made up of Mrs. Jack Lewis, ticket sales to schools; and Mrs. C. D. Herman and Mrs. Harry Chipman, ticket sales to members; Mrs. Fred Wilcox and Mrs. Fred Rankin, who will assist in radio, television and newspaper publicity.

Mrs. Cook will speak on the children's story hour October 11 to relate the story of the play, in which a donkey, "Boniface," is "the hero," which eventually

becomes a handsome prince.

Mrs. Emerson Anderson, the president, stated, "As college women, we are interested in all levels of education, and as mothers are especially glad to sponsor projects which will bring the best of literature, art, music and drama to preschool and grade school children. For this reason, we are again sponsoring a Children's story hour on Radio Station KYJC, and our annual play."
