

Medford Branch Carries Out Mission Goals:

AAUW promotes equity for all women and girls, life-long education and positive societal change. The Medford Branch accomplishes these through the following means:

Local Scholarships: The Medford Branch of AAUW has raised funds to assist Women in Jackson County further their college level work. In the early days, most of the funds assisted nursing students; now, a broad range of majors are funded. Students from Southern Oregon U. and Rogue Community College are eligible to apply. A committee of seven members reviews the applications to select worthy winners. Returning, older students, heads of household and mothers have benefited from these scholarships. This way to assist local students is in addition to Educational Foundation contributions. It is possible to make a tax deductible contribution to this effort. Contact branch officers to learn the procedure.

Legal Advocacy Fund The AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) works to end sex discrimination in higher education by providing moral and financial support for women filing discrimination lawsuits (to date, more than \$600,000). It actively promotes equal opportunities for women in higher education by providing legal information to women through its network of volunteer attorneys and social scientists who consult with them on legal strategy and the strength of their cases.

In the last 20 years, LAF has supported 58 sex discrimination cases on college campuses across the country. Its precedent-setting lawsuits have involved athletics, violence, and tenure. AAUW members and supporters contribute money, time and expertise to strengthen LAF's efforts to end sex discrimination in higher education.

The Educational Foundation is the heart of AAUW. Each year the Foundation awards over \$5 million dollars in fellowships and grants.

The Medford Branch is working to complete the Peggyann Hutchinson International Fellowship Endowment. When it reaches \$100,000 the interest will provide a stipend for a worthy International Fellow. International Fellows return home and make an impact in their society.

Proceeds from the Children's Festival food booth are used as the Branch's annual contribution to EF. Along with members' generous contributions, the endowment should be completed in about five years at the present rate. Donations of \$25 or more may be designated as a tribute or memorial to a friend or loved one. Members who donate \$100 become Century Club members and are honored at the annual EF luncheon and at the State Convention.

Lifelong Learning: Membership in AAUW enables women to continue their intellectual growth. General meeting programs emphasize issues and activities that need to be updated and/or explained, resulting in lifelong learning.

Changing circumstances, rapidly developing situations and improved knowledge are often a part of general meetings. Examples include explanation of ballot measures, new school emphases, changes in social security and other issues that require the attention of members in order to promote gender equity and social justice for women and girls. International affairs, book discussions and language study are also available in small group settings.

15. **New Members** - Half-year dues may be paid between November 15 and March 15. Full-year dues received after March 15 are applied to the fiscal year beginning July of that calendar year.
16. **Political Concerns** - Discussion of legislative concerns pertinent to AAUW's purpose and program is to be encouraged. Political speeches of a partisan nature or endorsing particular candidates will not be permitted at branch meetings or through the newsletter.
17. **President's Gift** - The 1st V.P. and Treasurer shall be in charge of the selection of the President's gift up to the amount budgeted. This gift shall represent the appreciation of the entire membership and shall be presented by the 1st Vice President at the General Meeting in June.
18. **Revisions** - These policies may be revised by Majority vote at any branch meeting.
19. **Use of Name:** The policies and program of the Association on matters of national scope shall be binding on all members and branches and no members or branch shall use the name of the Association to oppose such policies or program. Established channels may be used to change a policy or program. The freedom of speech of the individual member to speak his or her personal opinion in her own name is not abridged. Violation of the use of the Association's name shall result in:
 - A. A member's suspension for one year or expulsion from membership or
 - B. Loss of recognition of a branch
20. **Receipts:** AAUW Medford Branch members who receive cash for any AAUW purpose will issue a receipt and keep a copy of the receipt in a receipt book provided by the financial officer. These receipt books will be turned in for audit at the same time as the treasurer's books are audited.

9. **Educational Foundation Program -**
 - A. The Educational Foundation chair shall have the responsibility of educating members regarding the AAUW Foundation Program, its structure, history, and importance, source of income, and ways members can designate and restrict the expenditure of such money.
 - B. All monies specifically earned, contributed or in any way designated for the Educational Fund will be held in a separate account and not dispersed with operating expense monies.
 - C. A minimum \$1,000.00 named gift shall be sent to the Educational Foundation as revenue permits.
10. **Financial Contributions -** Since Branch members as individuals give to the support of local and national charitable organizations, Branches are advised against using Branch funds as token contributions for worthy causes.
11. **Interest Groups -** Interest groups are open only to women or men who are eligible for AAUW membership. Women/men eligible for membership in AAUW may not attend an interest group after 3 meetings unless they join the Branch. If a member chooses not to continue to pay her/his dues, she/he may not continue to attend meetings, including interest group meetings. Non-degree women or men who were members of these interest groups prior to April 1985 will be allowed to continue to attend, and pay \$10 per interest group joined. This fee will go into the Branch operating fund.
12. **Honorary Life Members -** Branch members who have become life members of the association through 50 years of continuous membership are exempt from payment of branch dues.
13. **Lunch Reservations -** Individual members who cancel a meal reservation after the reservations are closed or turned in are responsible for paying for them.
14. **Meetings:**
 - A. Branch meetings shall be held on the 1st Thursday or 1st Saturday of each month.
 - B. Board meetings will be held on the 3rd Thursday of each month.
 - C. Meeting schedule: *September* - 1st Saturday that does not conflict with the Labor Day weekend. Interest group sign up - Membership Tea. *January* - Legislative committee report on resolutions to be presented at convention. *Spring* - Fellowship Luncheon. Present named Fellowship Grant, Nomination Committee appointed for coming year's officers. *March* - Nominating committee report for coming year's officers. *April* - Elect officers, delegates to state convention. *May* - Membership Renewal, convention reports, present budget for next year. *June* - Installation of officers, approve budget for next year, evaluation of year's program.

AAUW POLICIES

1. **Board Members** - Board Members are expected to attend all branch and board meetings. Members who wish to propose a new item of business or deliver a report which may evoke considerable discussion are to give notice to the president in order to prepare it for the agenda.
 2. **Bylaws and Policies** - It is the responsibility of the president and recording secretary to be thoroughly familiar with the branch bylaws and policies and to have them available for reference at every branch and board meeting.
 3. **Change of address, phone or name** - This is to be reported to the membership chair. The membership chair will then notify the association, division, branch treasurer, and newsletter editor.
 4. **Community Activities** - It is our policy to help in any way we can with cultural or civic projects.
 5. **State Convention**: Expenses will be apportioned as to number of delegates and amount budgeted for that year for State Convention.
- Association Convention:** One member may apply for reimbursement of the registration fee. Half the registration fee for the Association Convention will be budgeted annually. If no one attends, the funds will revert to the general fund. Preference is given in the following order: 1) Current president; 2) Branch board members; 3) Other active and interested members. Members receiving this award are expected to report pertinent information to the branch.
6. **Courtesy** - The corresponding secretary will send get well, sympathy, or congratulatory cards to members whenever appropriate. Plants, flowers, or other gifts are to be excluded.
 7. **Donations** - No AAUW funds over \$50.00 will be expended without a 2/3 majority vote of membership at regular meetings of the Branch. Individual membership or participation may be considered.
 8. **Dues** - Deadline for paying dues to the treasurer shall be July 1.
