tion membership list at that time. Associate members are members of a branch and the state only, and may not serve as a state officer, or as branch officers fulfilling the functions of president, membership, program or finance.

Members-at-Large: A member-at-large of the Association residing within the state may become a member-at-large of the state upon payment of state dues. That member shall be entitled to vote and to serve on state committees, the state leadership team and the state board of directors.

College/University Members: A college or university within the state which is a college/university member of the Association shall also be a college/university member of the state and shall be entitled to representation at all state meetings.

Life Members:

Paid Life Members: Any member of the Association may become a life member of the Association upon a one-time payment of twenty (20) years' dues, based on the amount of Association dues the year that member elects to become a life member. Thereafter the life member shall be exempt from payment of Association dues. A paid life member who is a member of a branch continues to pay annual state dues.

Fifty-Year Honor: Any branch member who has paid Association dues for fifty (50) years shall become an honorary life member and shall thereafter be exempt from payment of Association and State dues.

Student Affiliates: An undergraduate student enrolled in a regionally accredited education institution shall be eligible for student affiliation. Student affiliates shall be entitled to attend Branch, State and Association meetings and receive the publication distributed to all members of the Association. Affiliates may not vote nor hold office. Fees for student affiliates shall be established by the Association Board of Directors. State fees shall be established by the State Leadership Team.

16. Political Concerns: Discussion of legislative concerns pertinent to AAUW's purpose and program is to be encouraged. Political speeches of a partisan nature or endorsing particular candidates will not be permitted at branch meetings or through the newsletter.

17. President's Gift: The 1st V.P. and Treasurer shall be in charge of the selection of the President's gift up to the amount budgeted. This gift shall represent the appreciation of the entire membership and shall be presented by the 1st Vice President at the General Meeting in June.

18. Revisions: These policies may be revised by majority vote at any branch meeting.

19. Use of Name: The policies and program of the Association on matters of national scope shall be binding on all members and branches and no members or branch shall use the name of the Association to oppose such policies or program. Established channels may be used to change a policy or program. The freedom of speech of the individual member to speak his or her personal opinion in his or her own name is not abridged. Violation of the use of the Association's name shall result in:
A. A member's suspension for one year or expulsion from membership, or
B. Loss of recognition of a branch.

20. Receipts: AAUW Medford Branch members who receive cash for any AAUW purpose will issue a receipt and keep a copy of the receipt in a receipt book provided by the financial officer. These receipt books will be turned in for audit at the same time as the treasurer's books are audited.

AAUW POLICIES

- 1. Board Members:** Board Members are expected to attend all Branch and Board meetings. Members who wish to propose a new item of business or deliver a report which may evoke considerable discussion are to give notice to the president in order to prepare the agenda.
- 2. Bylaws and Policies:** It is the responsibility of the president and recording secretary to be thoroughly familiar with the Branch Bylaws and policies and to have them available for reference at every Branch and Board meeting.
- 3. Change of Address, Phone, or Name:** This is to be reported to the membership chair. The membership chair will then notify the Association, State, Branch treasurer, database manager and newsletter editor.
- 4. Community Activities:** It is our policy to help in any way we can with cultural or civic projects.
- 5. State Convention:** Expenses will be apportioned as to number of delegates and amount budgeted for that year for State Convention.

Association Convention: One member may apply for reimbursement of the registration fee. Half the registration fee for the Association Convention will be budgeted annually. If no one attends, the funds will revert to the general fund. Preference is given in the following order: 1) Current president; 2) Branch Board members; 3) Other active and interested members. Members receiving this award are expected to report pertinent information to the Branch.

- 6. Courtesy:** The corresponding secretary will send get well, sympathy, or congratulatory cards to members whenever appropriate. Plants, flowers, or other gifts are to be excluded.
- 7. Donations:** No AAUW funds over \$50 will be expended without a 2/3 majority vote of membership at regular meetings of the Branch.
- 8. Dues:** Deadline for paying dues to the treasurer shall be July 1.
- 9. Educational Foundation Program:**
 - A. The Educational Foundation chair shall have the responsibility of educating members regarding the AAUW Foundation Program, its structure, history, and importance, source of income, and ways members can designate and restrict the expenditure of such money.
 - B. All monies specifically earned, contributed or in any way designated for the Educational Fund will be held in a separate account and not dispersed with operating expense monies.
 - C. A minimum \$1,000 named gift shall be sent to the Educational Foundation as revenue permits.
- 10. Financial Contributions:** Since Branch members as individuals give to the support of local and national charitable organizations, Branches are advised against using Branch funds as token contributions for worthy causes.

AAUW membership. Women/men eligible for membership in AAUW may not attend an interest group after three meetings unless they join the Branch. If a member chooses not to continue to pay her/his dues, she/he may not continue to attend meetings, including interest group meetings. Non-degreed women or men who were members of these interest groups prior to April 1985 will be allowed to continue to attend, and pay \$10 per interest group joined. This fee will go into the Branch operating fund.

12. Honorary Life Members: Branch members who have become life members of the Association through 50 years of continuous membership are exempt from payment of branch dues.

13. Lunch Reservations: Individual members who cancel a meal reservation after the reservations are closed or turned in are responsible for paying for them.

14. Meetings:

A. Branch meetings shall be held on the 1st Thursday or 1st Saturday of each month.

B. Board meetings will be held on the 3rd Thursday of each month.

C. Meeting Schedule:

15. New Members

Dues: Half-year dues may be paid between January 1 and March 15. Full-year dues received after March 15 are applied to the fiscal year beginning July of that calendar year.

Membership Eligibility:

Basis for Membership: Individuals eligible to be admitted to membership are those holding an associate or equivalent, baccalaureate or higher degree from a qualified educational institution, a degree from a foreign institution recognized by the International Federation of University Women (IFUW), or a foreign degree acceptable as a basis for admission by graduate schools at qualified universities of the U.S.A. who have paid dues on or before July 1 annually to a branch treasurer or to the Association finance vice-president. The provisions set forth in this section shall be the sole requirements for eligibility and admissibility to membership. Refusal to admit an eligible individual to branch membership shall result in loss of recognition of a branch.

Branches: All branches within the state shall be members of this state.

Branch Members: A branch member is one who maintains AAUW membership through a branch.

Associate Members: An associate member is one who was admitted prior to July 1, 1957, upon completion of at least two years of nonprofessional work as would have been credited toward an approved degree in any college or university on the Associa-

tion membership list at that time. Associate members are members of a branch and the state only, and may not serve as a state officer, or as branch officers fulfilling the functions of president, membership, program or finance.

Members-at-Large: A member-at-large of the Association residing within the state may become a member-at-large of the state upon payment of state dues. That member shall be entitled to vote and to serve on state committees, the state leadership team and the state board of directors.

College/University Members: A college or university within the state which is a college/university member of the Association shall also be a college/university member of the state and shall be entitled to representation at all state meetings.

Life Members:

Paid Life Members: Any member of the Association may become a life member of the Association upon a one-time payment of twenty (20) years' dues, based on the amount of Association dues the year that member elects to become a life member. Thereafter the life member shall be exempt from payment of Association dues. A paid life member who is a member of a branch continues to pay annual state dues.

Fifty-Year Honor: Any branch member who has paid Association dues for fifty (50) years shall become an honorary life member and shall thereafter be exempt from payment of Association and State dues.

Student Affiliates: An undergraduate student enrolled in a regionally accredited education institution shall be eligible for student affiliation. Student affiliates shall be entitled to attend Branch, State and Association meetings and receive the publication distributed to all members of the Association. Affiliates may not vote nor hold office. Fees for student affiliates shall be established by the Association Board of Directors. State fees shall be established by the State Leadership Team.

16. Political Concerns: Discussion of legislative concerns pertinent to AAUW's purpose and program is to be encouraged. Political speeches of a partisan nature or endorsing particular candidates will not be permitted at branch meetings or through the newsletter.

17. President's Gift: The 1st V.P. and Treasurer shall be in charge of the selection of the President's gift up to the amount budgeted. This gift shall represent the appreciation of the entire membership and shall be presented by the 1st Vice President at the General Meeting in June.

18. Revisions: These policies may be revised by majority vote at any branch meeting.

19. Use of Name: The policies and program of the Association on matters of national scope shall be binding on all members and branches and no members or branch shall use the name of the Association to oppose such policies or program. Established channels may be used to change a policy or program. The freedom of speech of the individual member to speak his or her personal opinion in his or her own name is not abridged. Violation of the use of the Association's name shall result in:
A. A member's suspension for one year or expulsion from membership, or
B. Loss of recognition of a branch.

20. Receipts: AAUW Medford Branch members who receive cash for any AAUW purpose will issue a receipt and keep a copy of the receipt in a receipt book provided by the financial officer. These receipt books will be turned in for audit at the same time as the treasurer's books are audited.

MEDFORD BRANCH MISSION ACTIVITIES

AAUW advances equity for women and girls through advocacy, education and research. The Medford Branch promotes the AAUW mission through the following projects.

Local Scholarships: The Branch raises funds to assist women in Jackson County to further their education at Rogue Community College and Southern Oregon University. In earlier years most of the funds assisted nursing students; now a broad range of majors are supported. A scholarship selection committee reviews applications to select worthy recipients. Returning, older students, heads of households and mothers have benefited from these scholarships.

Legal Advocacy Fund: The AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) provides funding and a support system for individuals seeking judicial redress for sex discrimination. In the past years the primary focus has been on women working in higher education, who file discrimination lawsuits. Starting in 2008-2009 the focus of LAF will expand beyond academia to the needs of women regardless of their workplace. LAF will seek cases that address significant, deserving issues that have precedent-setting potential to make a difference for all women, to make all workplaces free of sex discrimination.

Education Foundation: At the national level, the AAUW Education Foundation (EF) has been a core program of AAUW. Each year the Foundation awards over \$3.5 million dollars in graduate fellowships and grants to women. The Medford Branch established and continues to support the Peggyann Hutchinson International Fellowship Endowment. This Endowment provides a stipend for an International Fellow, who then returns home to make a positive impact on her society.

The Branch also supports the Kenneth McGraw Memorial Fund, which was established to provide grants and project awards to U.S. citizens.

Part of the proceeds from the Children's Festival food booth and member contributions comprise the Branch's annual giving to EF. Funds may be designated to a particular fellowship or fund, such as the Hutchinson or McGraw funds, or any of the many named funds under EF. Donations of \$25 or more may be designated as tributes or memorials to friends and loved ones. Members who donate \$100 become Century Club members and are honored at the annual Scholarship/EF Luncheon and at the state convention.

Advancing Equity for Women and Girls: Membership in AAUW offers opportunities to learn about the issues and hot topics that affect equity for women and girls. Programs at monthly branch meetings emphasize issues and topics tied to the AAUW mission and vision. This translates to programs that inform and educate on subjects that impact the lives of women and girls. Examples include explanation of ballot measures, new school emphases, changes in social security, local community issues and other topics on educational and economic barriers for women.

The Branch is now an active partner with Rogue Community College (RCC) for mission-related projects. Last year the Branch assisted RCC with two special programs to educate high school girls and young women on challenges and strategies to achieve

financial equity in the future. The Branch also supports the RCC student mentor program. AAUW strives to be a visible leader in advancing equity for women and girls, with informed and knowledgeable members.

In addition to the activities mentioned above, the Medford Branch has maintained an active presence in the community over the years. The Branch helped pass the library bond measure, worked for juvenile justice bonds, assisted with *Asset Building* training and assisted the *West Medford Integration Site*.
