The AAUW Conference was very interesting, and left me mulling over various questions about the future of AAUW. Along with the rest of society, we pivoted to Zoom and pared down our lives. As we resume inperson activities, we need to look at what we are providing and make sure that it's something that adds value to people's lives. What should we look like in ten years? What should we be doing? What should we drop? What should we change? (If your crystal ball is giving you some answers, please share them with me. Mine is not working.)

These questions tie in with our **Visibility group**. Looking towards the fall, we are planning to create a bookmark with our programs and to revise the brochure about Medford AAUW. If you go someplace regularly that has a public bulletin board, please think about keeping it stocked with information about us. We will be encouraging members to wear their nametags to meetings (if you don't have one, check with Carol Julian), and asking two members to serve as greeters at meetings to make guests feel welcomed. At the conference, the major business was changing from a delegate system to one-member, one-vote system, which did pass. In the future, if you are a registered member of the state AAUW and are in good standing 30 days prior to the meeting, you will be able to vote at the meeting.

We had an interesting program in April, with Debra Lee from the **Center for Non-Profit Legal Services**. This law firm focuses on providing legal representation to the elderly (over 60) and/or low-income (at or below 125 percent of the federal poverty level) who face critical legal needs (food, shelter, medical care, income maintenance, and physical safety). It's wonderful knowing that such services are available.

We also elected a slate of officers for next year. Many thanks to everyone who is willing to serve!

I really enjoyed the talk that Michael Dotson, of **KS Wild**, gave in March, about wilderness areas in the Klamath and Siskiyou regions and what is being done to protect them. Here's wishing all of us a lovely (not too hot, not too smoky) summer! See you in the fall!

MUWCF (Medford University Women's Charitable Fund) is delighted to report that the 2023 Phantom Tea Party brought in \$9,255 to provide scholarships for women in Southern Oregon. In addition, members donated \$800 to AAUW Funds to support women in graduate studies. From the funds members donated, the MUWCF Board was able to award four \$2,700 scholarships to RCC, two \$2,700 scholarships to SOU, and one \$950 scholarship to ACADE-MY.

ACADEMY, a camp for academically talented students completing grades 5-8, will be scheduled in June on the SOU campus. This will be the 42nd year that ACADEMY has provided this residential camp to students in the Pacific Northwest. The \$950 tuition includes housing, meals, and outstanding programs and activities.
