Medford AAUW Member pilot **Monica Weyhe** (left), and pilot friend Sherry Kandle, spent 3 weeks in June involved in the all-women's national **Air Race Classic** (ARC). This is the modern version of the race that was started in 1929 by Amelia Earhart and other women pilots, because they were not allowed to fly in the men's race. The ARC mission is to encourage and educate current and future women pilots.

STEA(aviation)M skills were tested in planning, navigation with new instruments, strategy and more over the course of the 4-day, 2500 mile route which changes every year. They flew in Sherry's Cessna 182, shown in this stop in Ohio, down for a short break after flying the timing line. Almost as challenging was flying through the Rockies to the start in southern Illinois and then back through the Rockies again after the terminus festivities in Loveland, Colorado.

This timed race over 9 legs is won by the team who beats their handicapped speed by the most, down to the thousandth of a second! after subtracting time for penalties. Leg prizes are awarded as well. Sherry & Monica were stunned with joy to hear their team, Free Rein, called out as the **first place** winner of Leg 1 and learn that they beat their handicap speed by almost 37 mph!
