Community Works strengthens lives and our community through prevention, support services, and advocacy for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and homeless youth and their families.

Founded in 1996, Community Works is the only domestic and sexual violence resource center serving Jackson County. The organization was created as a merger between three community organizations that had been providing crisis intervention in Southern Oregon since the mid-1970s. As a 501(C)(3) non-profit, Community Works is funded by government and private grants, and United Way, and the generosity of our community. All services are free and confidential.

Community Works offers one-on-one support and advocacy to over 13,000 people each year.

Barbara Johnson holds the role of Executive Director.

Her involvement with the organization began as a volunteer, then in an advisory capacity and later the Board of Directors. She transitioned to the agency as Program Director for Advocacy Services. In 2016, recognizing her contributions and dedication, she was promoted to the role of Executive Director.

Outside of her professional commitments, Barbara finds joy in gardening, reading, and gathering for dinners with family and friends. Her commitment to Community Works stems from a strong belief that everyone deserves safety and the opportunity to live with hope.



## An update from **Charity Woodrum**, our keynote at **AAUW Oregon Conference** last April:

#### "Quarterback of Life"

Charity recently shared *SPACE, HOPE and CHARITY* and spoke with students through the **Beating the Odds Foundation**, which strives to help middle and high school students imagine and realize their futures.

When students were taken to Goddard Space Flight Center a few weeks later, Charity was invited to join them for lunch. She was stunned to arrive to find she'd be sitting across the table from former Astronaut Scott "Scooter" Altman, who flew four space shuttle missions and performed many of the aerial stunts in the film, "Top Gun!" As they toured with the group, Altman told people that he fixed the Hubble Space Telescope and that Charity works with the data that it still sends down to Earth. We love these connections, and Charity loves meeting astronauts!

#### SHERRY SCHROEDER: ADVOCATE, LEADER, FRIEND

Sherry Schroeder was born Sherry Mast in 1948. Born in Moscow, Idaho, she grew up in Medford after her family moved here in 1957 where her dad was a teacher at Medford High School. Her parents divorced in 1962 with

custody of four girls going to the father.

Sherry helped raise two younger sisters during Jr. Hi and Hi School. She graduated with a double major from the University of Oregon in 1971 with a BS in Health Education and Physical Education.

In 1969, Sherry married Steve Schroeder, her neighbor from Medford since 3rd and 4th grade, also a DUCK! After graduation, in 1971, they moved to Pensacola, Fla. to begin Steve's career as a Navy pilot for 7 yrs. In 1972, and during the Vietnam war, they returned to the Bay Area where Steve was based at Alameda Naval Air Station, flying out San Diego to aircraft carriers.

Sherry began a career in business. Steve flew as a United Airlines captain for 32 years. In the Bay Area, Sherry worked in management in the male dominated steel industry, where, after 11 years, she hit the proverbial glass ceiling. She began a real estate career in management with Century 21 in 1983.

Moving to east Medford in 2008, where she lives currently, she helped the Medford branch create their Strategic Plan, tries to volunteer her services wherever needed, plays bridge, and has enjoyed the privilege of being the Installing Officer. A supporter of LAF, she belongs to the Legacy Circle, attends AAUW OREGON State Meetings, and enjoys the many friendships she has formed.


